He was one of the pioneers of the town and one of his sons explored and discovered many of the caves at Wombeyan. He was caretaker of the caves for many years. We opted not to stay the night at Taralga and drove back to Oberon to stay at 'The Big Trout' motel to be closer to Sunday's events.

SUNDAY 29th APRIL:

Next day we headed back to the Caltex Service Station at Yetholme for breakfast before heading over the road to set up a control for the <u>Classic Rally Club</u>'s 'Run With No Beer'. This was also on the <u>TCC</u> Calendar. Our control point was at a Tee Junction – a very good spot with some sunshine but a very cold wind! The competitors had to go through our control twice but turning in opposite directions at the TJ each time. From TCC we saw Brett & Belinda Manewell (Apprentice Level) along with Joy & Neil Hood, Karen & Greg Yates as well as lan Packard – all in the Tour Category. Unfortunately, many teams found the navigation a bit difficult and thought some of the answers to the questions were a bit obscure. However, most agreed that the majority of the roads were fantastic. As yet, I have not seen any results for this event. Many crews were quite late reaching our control which meant we were late heading back to our third (and final) event for the weekend.

Incidentally, we would recommend both of those country hotels for lunch if you are looking for a venue one weekend.

- Our only event was the very popular Amaroo Dirt Circuit conducted by Hills District but largely run by TCC. There were 75 starters. Col Atkinson was best TCC in his VW Golf with a time of 32.2 seconds. Denise Harrison ran a Cortina and Janelle Lansley ran her Alfasud. How about getting back behind the wheel girls?
- Socially, we went to the Roxy Theatre in Parramatta to see 'The Betsy' then to the Spaghetti Cellar for dinner.

1983:

- Editor, Steve Lansley and I, as President, both dealt with non-TCC subjects not very exciting, but we did have a big month. We had a huge roll-up at our meeting at Hornsby where Bob Shields showed a 16mm movie (remember those?) of the 1982 James Hardie 1000. Cheryl Joass won the raffle and Bruce Firth got second prize. What was it Bruce?
- On the Queen's Birthday weekend we had a motorkhana, barbeque and fireworks night at Leppington. We had 74 starters. Don Adams was the director. FTD was Phil East in his Mini Special. Equal 2nd and best TCC were Garry Elliott (Datsun 1600) and Geoff Ford (Golf). Peter Batt won Class B in Jo-Anne's Civic. We were running the Bellett then, and after a WD (in the same event as Ernie) I only just beat Wendy by less than a second.
- We had a fancy-dress party at Maher's house with some very imaginative outfits. Who could ever forget Phil Coffey's "Professor Sumner Miller' or Ken Barnwell and Mick Laing in their army outfits. And then there was Kate!!!!! A great night maybe we should do it again sometime soon? Once every 20 years is probably enough!
- Wendy & I directed the President's Trophy Trial. A question involving the number of seats in Wahroonga Park caused some on-going controversy and after a 'tribunal', the winners were Neil & Joy Hood from a field of 12. The event finished with a barbeque at Maher's (again).

198<u>8:</u>

• President Phil Coffey wrote about the need for us to pursue incorporation as insurance and liability problems were starting to rear their ugly heads – even then.

- Steve Bicket ran a khana cross at Leppington, which was described as 'fan-bloody-tastic'. Garry Elliott won it (surprise, surprise) and Ernie Boston was second.
- We had our first run at the new Nelsons Plains dirt circuit owned by MG Newcastle. This proved to be a great venue and we went back many times until advancing housing developments forced its closure at the end of the '90s.
- It was at this time that Steve Bicket introduced TCC to the enormous black Ford Galaxy that he (and several other members) ran at all events for some time. While not terribly competitive, it was none the less spectacular.

1993:

- Editor Ray Rowe appealed for help in organising events and for more contributions of articles for the magazine. He also drew our attention to the fact that the following year was our 40th year.
- As President, I reported on the huge number of non-TCC Point Score events that members were involved in - including Group E racing, speed events at Huntley Hill Climb and Amaroo and Oran Park Super Sprints. There were rallies in the Watagan Forest and places like Gilgandra, Bulahdelah and Taree and there was the first attack on Historic rallying by Wendy & myself at Bathurst.
- Our only Point Score event was a dirt circuit at Jilliby where our stars were Les Payne in his Laser 4WD, Garry Elliott, Trevor Parsonage and Warren Midgley. Ross Miller rolled his Escort but kicked the windscreen out and continued running for the rest of the day.
- Bits from Boston really bagged grass / dirt motorkhanas, saying how tar motorkhanas are much more popular and more fun. It looks as though the pendulum is now swinging the other way.

Interested in becoming an Official?

To ensure our events run properly and that our regular officials have a chance to also compete, we need more members to obtain officials licences. Thankfully CAMS are making this process easier.

We need all current Trainee officials to upgrade to General officials. This involves officiating for one day and filling out a Trainee form and then completing an online Introductory module. This can be completed in any order. By becoming a General official, it will mean less work for the Event Secretary, but you will also receive a CAMS Officials Licence Book similar to your CAMS Competition Licence Book. Whenever you officiate, this book then gets signed by a member of the organising committee for that event.

This log of events can then be used when upgrading your licence to a Bronze level. It is of note that Bronze level official licences never expire.

TCC really NEED MORE Bronze level Event Admin, Event Command and Scrutineer officials. We simply do not have enough of these in the club to allow members to only officiate in a higher role at one TCC event in a year allowing them to compete in other events.

Just to repeat that Bronze level official licences never expire. For members a little worried about learning and performing these roles, please be assured that we have many members in the club who are happy to mentor you through this process. Help is never far away. Some roles will require you to be actively involved in the organisation of the event so leaving this to the last minute will not benefit yourself with any potential assessments. TCC has plenty of events that you can help run and upgrade your licence, so please have a good think about it and speak to an Executive member in order to start the process.






A Game of Numbers!

At the end of last year, I put my hand up to direct the TCC State Motorkhana for 2018 with the idea that we'd run a Multi-club event off the back of it in the hope that this would increase competitor numbers. Unfortunately, TCC has lost money at the last couple of State motorkhanas it has run, so we were trying to find a way to turn this around.

The idea behind this was that there are a number of people out there who simply like to compete in motorkhanas just for the fun especially where they can have a mate or family member sit alongside. It also meant that the Multi-club competitors didn't have to do a reversing test, although this requirement for State motorkhanas was removed for 2018. So the concept was simple, State motorkhana plus the Multi-club motorkhana. I had previously created a set of motorkhana supp regs to demonstrate what I was trying to do and thought that this should be relatively easy to then update and submit to CAMS with the permit application.

Well, most of you have already heard of the troubles I had getting the entry form and the supp regs (in relation to the passenger clause) through CAMS, but with roughly a month to spare it was all sorted. I then set out to select the tests for the State competitors. These are particular championship tests in the CAMS Motorkhana booklet and can't be amended, so I chose the ones where the formats were relatively similar to others to reduce the time for changes to the set up before the next test could start. I selected 12 tests, although historically we only get through 9 considering the State championship requires 2 runs at each test. With the Multi-club however I wanted to do something different. Most multi-club events I have been to only

allow 1 run at each test, which means you really need to concentrate as there is no second chance. And with Multi-club events comes the opportunity to be more creative with tests, as there is no requirement to have specific tests or specific dimensions so they can be tweaked or even created from scratch to be as fun or as tricky as you want. I decided that for the most part, the multi-club competitors would do the same test as the State competitors for their first run through but when the State competitors complete their second attempt, the Multi-club competitors would have a completely new test to do. To ensure that this could still work with the flag format of the test being used for the State competitors, it meant a few new tests!




The lead up to the event also saw me handwashing the TCC numbers used for Ernie's Revenge to get all of the Ansell Park dust off!

Thankfully with all of the paperwork sorted (complete with colour coded documentation to make it easy to distinguish between State and Multi-club paperwork), it meant I could focus more on the marking up of the tests the day before the event. I had kept on eye on the weather and whilst it was meant to be cold, there wasn't meant to be any rain, though it did start to spit. As Andrew and I drove down to the parade grounds at Nirimba TAFE, we were absolutely shocked at the encroachment of housing development. Sadly, it probably won't be too much longer before people buying into that area will start complaining about the noise from motorsport and advanced driver training events, which will more than likely spell the end of competition at Nirimba.

Anyway, we had a great team of TCC members to help out including John Crowley, Geoff Horler, Steve Lansley, Phil Coffey, Matt Rath, Alana Dean, Andrew Crowley and my underage slave labourers Emma and Adam! We managed to get all tests marked out with chalk and flouro pink washers in under 2 hours!











On the day of the event, I was again pleased with the amount of help from TCC for this event. With so many hands on deck, it meant that I could hang around the Secretary table in the morning and check out the breath testing going on! Yes, that's right. We had CAMS appointed CATO's breath testing the essential officials and all competitors. It's the first time I have ever seen CATO's at a State motorkhana, so the whole process was new to almost all of us. I can thankfully report that there was a 100% pass rate of everyone who was tested!

As entries trickled in, it became obvious that we had significantly more officials than competitors so several officials were given the option of competing instead! In all we ended up with 17 State competitors and 14 Multi-club competitors, a total of 31 competitors and 21 officials! The numbers of competitors were much smaller than I was hoping for, however I am told that it is still higher than earlier State rounds so I should still be pleased with the turn out.

The competition started a little late, after the trophy presentation for the 2017 State Championship Class winners and Round 4 of the NSW 2018 Motorkhana Championship. The competitors and the officials handled the new set up really well and the transition between State and Multi-club competitors and tests was absolutely seamless. The State section had 2 competitors from TCC being Dave Masing and Brett Manewell. Both were a little off their normal high level game with Dave being unwell and Brett suffering car handbrake issues. They were both still great to watch with Dave finishing 7th outright and 1st Class C and Brett finishing 12th outright and 4th Class B. Drive of the



day, albeit short due to mechanical issues, was that of Corrine East-Johnson who completed the most perfect reverse flick straight into the finish garage on the Forward & Reverse Slalom test on her first attempt. This amazing drive was also 1.5 seconds faster than the next fastest competitor. It truly isn't hard to see why she is a previous Australian Motorkhana Champion. All State competitors managed 2 runs at the full 12 tests on offer.

The Multi-club section had 8 TCC starters including Rob Parsonage, Dominic Connolly, Vicki and Zach Gillon, Tim Hurst, Glenn Moulds, Ian Polczynski and Harrison Baber. It would have been 9 from TCC except Blake Rochford-Cole has recently let his membership lapse! It is of note that 9 of the 14 Multi-club competitors had passengers for almost every run of the day and you could just not wipe the smiles from their faces!

On the day it was a bit hard to see how each competitor was going, but there were a few notable moments. Zach and Harrison where navigating for each other, so it's pretty funny when one of them unfortunately gets a WD but then when they swap seats, the test is done correctly! Thankfully there were just laughs between them and they carried on!

Tim Hurst, a new TCC member, seemed fairly consistent in his driving all day and was rewarded with an FTD on test 16! Glenn Moulds and Ian Polczynski were great fun to be around to hear the banter. Glenn had convinced himself that he would remember where to go and with 10 WD's from 24 tests, but what was very surprising was that on two tests he was roughly 0.5 seconds away from an FTD, so all in all this was actually a great first go at a motorkhana! Ian's times were quite impressive for a 15 year old, but he did break the golden rule and beat the owner of the vehicle! Be careful Ian, if you are too fast you might not get another drive!!!

Dominic "I'm only here for sh#ts and giggles" Connolly didn't care about his times and wasn't overly fussed when he ended up with a WD. Dominic ended up 8th outright, but actually managed 5 FTD's, but we all knew he could drive!

Rob 'Rev Limiter' Parsonage gave the little Mazda everything it had and with Elizabeth Fennell all smiles and along for the ride, he ended up with 6 FTD's and taking him to a comfortable first outright over 50 seconds clear of 2nd place! Apart from 1 flag, Rob had a clean run all day and was disappointed that after 24 tests, there were no more tests left to finish off the remaining rubber on his tyres!

To me however, the drive of the day for the Multi-club section came from Vicki "I'll be going very slowly so look out" Gillon! Vicki did pick up 3 WD's and 3 flags, but also bagged herself a total of 3 FTD's!!! This not so slow drive, landed her in 4th outright and 1st in Class F! That's pretty impressive, so congrats on a great drive.

Gary Moore and Jamie Skuse from HDCC were there in a Holden Commodore and were great to watch. The tyre squeal, smoke and drifting was a definite crowd pleaser, though it was very clear that they were having more fun than those of us watching from the sideline!

Even with the delayed start, and a few delays through the day, the Multi-club competitors completed a total

of 24 different tests. This was helped by the huge number of officials who subbed for each other giving everyone a lunch break with no stop to competition. Competition finished around 3:30pm, so it was truly a jam packed, value for money day and I'm sure all of the Multiclub competitors went home with a foggy brain after trying to remember so many different tests!

A massive thank you to all of the competitors and officials who helped with the pack up of the event, which saw all of us out of Nirimba before 5pm! Many hands really do make light work!



An even bigger thank you to both Matt and Alana for offering to come around after the event to help us with the results as they knew that I also had the magazine to complete during the same timeframe. They were all done by about 9:30pm and after a few checks, they were released on Monday night. After one error with a trophy, it appears that these provisional results will be final results when you read this magazine.
